


Figure 1: You may include a figure in your abstract. Please use 9-point font for the caption. Please strive for a figure that makes more sense than this one. Studies of (a) earthquake fault instability, (b) the mechano-responsiveness of trichome cells, (c) fuzzy molecular assemblages, and (d) strain mapping in soft tissues will all be found at the 2019 SES meeting at Washington University in St. Louis.

An image would be welcomed (Figure 1). Up to one image may be included.
